Here's the scoop...

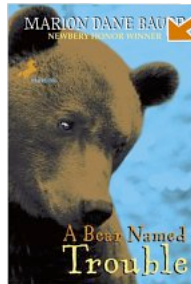
Get ready for the first Cherry Road Reads adventure of the 2007-2008 school year! (Based on the CNY Reads initiative)
