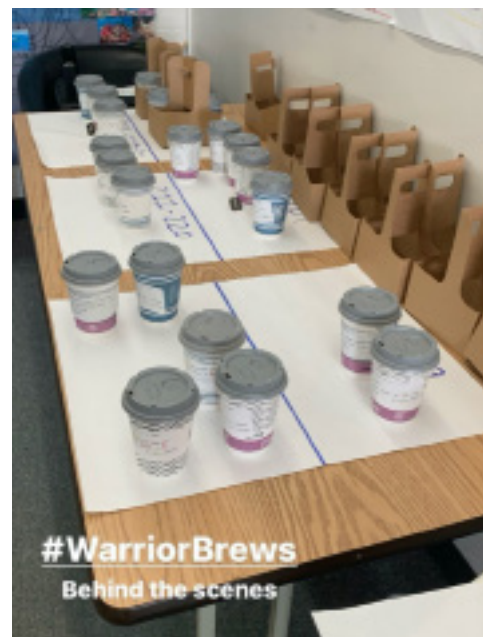


Warrior Brews

The students of Mr. Zaia's Consumer Math class have started a coffee delivery service in Westhill High School known affectionately as Warrior Brews. Started shortly after the new year, the students have been providing coffee for the high school staff about twice a week for the last two months. In order to make sure the students did not become overwhelmed with the potential daunting undertaking, they spent weeks devising a plan of expansion, Google order form, supply lists and functional working space to ensure they would be able to make and deliver their coffees around the school in the allotted class period. The class has expanded Warrior Brews throughout the whole school and have incorporated almost every staff member in the building thus far.

While the idea of coffee sounds fun, the lessons in the process are what the students are learning through the project. Warrior Brews allows the students to practice different decision making and direction following tasks while creating the drinks, their interpersonal skills when they are delivering to staff they may or may not know personally and their math skills as they perform cost analysis and inventory on the other days of the week. The students love to be able to show the staff of WHS how much they appreciate their hard work and dedication to the school by delivering a hot drink right to their classroom or office.

Warrior Brews offers coffee, hot chocolate, seasonal flavors (currently maple pecan) and a variety of hot teas. Staff also have a choice of adding flavors of creamers or sugar and even marshmallows if they choose!

First grade scientists at Walberta Park make predictions and experiment with the shape and size of shadows. A lot of terrific scientific conversations taking place!



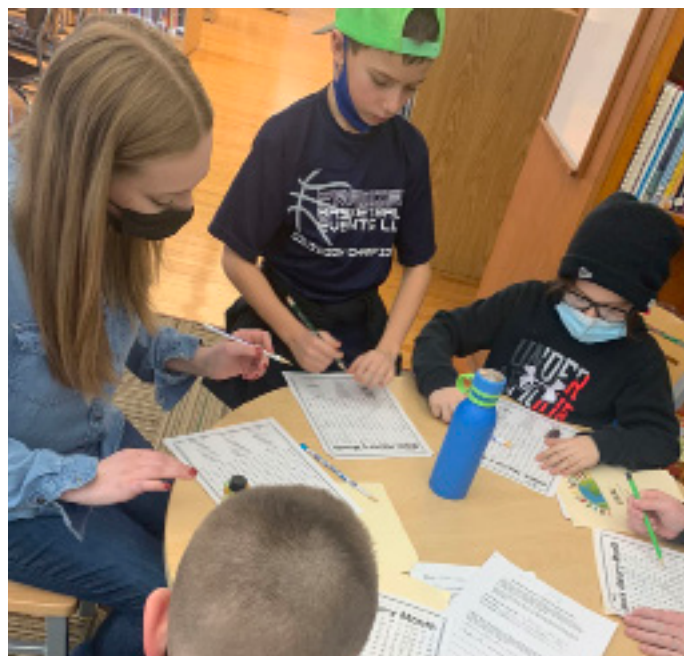
Physical Education Fun

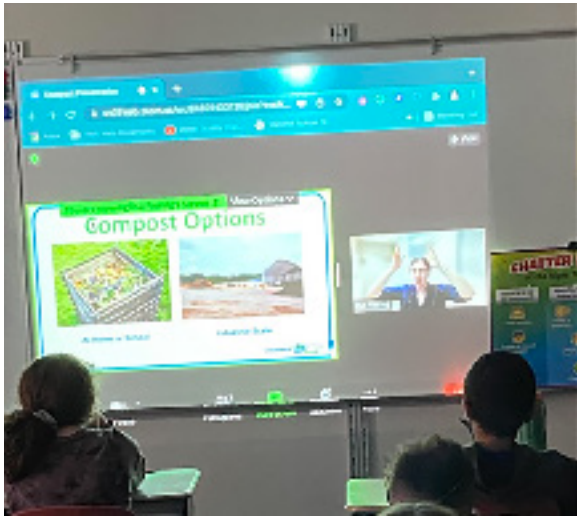

During Black History Month, honors biology students spent time learning about Henrietta Lacks and the contributions her HeLa cells made to science. Henrietta's story is a compelling one. Students kicked off the project by reading parts of the "Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks" by Rebecca Skloot. While listening to her story, students created an extensive list of questions, one of which would become their focus question for their project. All students were tasked with discussing her life, the bioethics surrounding her story, along with the contributions made from her cells. We also spent time learning about bioethics, engaging in debates, using library databases and citing information in APA format!

In the shared slideshow, you will learn about her cells and why they're considered immortal, why scientists sent them into outer space and how they were used to create the polio and Covid vaccines, chemotherapy drugs and much more. Some students focused on the ethics surrounding consent to use our cells for research purposes (while others profit), some focused on race, income and education and the role it played in her treatment as a black female in the 1950s. At the end of each sports season, the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) honors those teams and individuals that excel in the classroom. The student-athletes, teams and schools work very hard throughout the year and deserve to be recognized for their academic success. To receive Scholar-Athlete team recognition the team's average GPA for 75% of the roster must be greater than or equal to 90%. If a team does not meet the Scholar-Athlete Team Criteria, the individuals on that team with a 90% or above GPA are considered individual Scholar-Athletes. This winter Westhill had five varsity teams earning the team honor. Scholar Athlete teams include boys' basketball, girls' basketball, boys' indoor track and field, girls' indoor track and field and ice hockey. Westhill had 110 varsity athletes participating in the winter 2022 season. Out of this 110 athletes, 90 earned a 90% or greater average for the 2nd quarter earning individual scholar athlete honors.

Westhill Educational Foundation Grants

The Westhill Educational Foundation is pleased to announce grant recipients for the 2021-2022 academic year. The Foundation has streamlined the grant submission process and will now review grants throughout the academic year. This updated process will allow the Foundation to be more adaptive to the changing needs of the school district. The spring grant cycle is still open and will continue to take grant applications through the end of June or until the budget limit is reached. This year, thanks to support from our generous donors, the Foundation has been able to grant over \$9,800 to support innovative ideas and programs for Westhill students. Winners to date are:

Fall Grant Recipients

An Evening with Author Jason Reynolds, Penny Feeney

This grant provided funding for 50 students in grades 6-12 to attend a lecture from New York Times bestselling author Jason Reynolds as part of the Rosamond Gifford Authors Series. Students were transported to the OnCenter to listen to Reynolds' storytelling and insights.

Measuring Carbon Output; Designing Innovative Solutions to Reducing Atmospheric Carbon Dioxide, Alaina Weinsztok and Helen Kemper

This grant purchased 15 GoDirect CO2 Gas Sensors that students in 9th and 10th grade biology will use in their Cycle of Matter unit. These CO2 probes allow students to measure in real time the amount of atmospheric Carbon Dioxide. The probes will generate a live graph that can be sent directly to their cell phones (via bluetooth) or school chromebooks/laptops. This will encourage students to make better decisions as consumers and illustrate that their decisions have a positive impact on the environment as they attempt to reduce the amount of Carbon being released into the atmosphere.

Mush On: Voices from the Iditarod, Karen Fenner and Tracy Crisafulli

This grant provided funding for a unique learning opportunity for Environmental Science students at Westhill High School. Students were given copies of *Winterdance: The Fine Madness of Alaskan Dog-Racing* by award-winning author Gary Paulsen which complimented classroom lessons on genetics and adaptation. This experience culminated in a presentation by former Alaskan Iditarod racer, Karen Land, who brought a sled dog, race gear and insight into many aspects of dogsled racing including weather, animal behavior and personal experiences in the wilds of Alaska. In addition, there was a second session open to all interested WHS students to meet Karen Land and her dog during IA.

Let Your Curiosity Soar II, Penny Feeney

This grant, which was co-written by OHMS 7th grader Owen Wilmot, funded the purchase of a DJI Air 2S drone to be used at Onondaga Hill Middle school in conjunction with the Technology Class and GNN Video Production Club. Students will be able to learn how to use the drone and will be able to earn their drone "OHMS License".

Spring Grant Recipients

Insights and Inspirations with Dusti Bowling, Penny Feeney

This grant is designed to generate excitement for an upcoming visit to Onondaga Middle School from author Dusti Bowling. In addition to funding a daily author book giveaway the month before the visit, the grant will also help to fund a breakfast and lunch with the visiting author.

Fitness Room Upgrade, Jason Clavijo

This grant funded the purchase of 3 rowing machines for the Onondaga Hill Middle School fitness room. The rowers will be used to increase the versatility of creating a fitness routine for the students. The rowers can accommodate every student providing expanded opportunities for all students at the middle school.

Game on!, Penny Feeney

This grant encourages students to socialize and build relationships at Onondaga Hill Middle School through the purchase of a variety of board games and mindfulness activities. The games will be available in the library, will be accessible to all students during study hall and will serve as a way for students to engage, de-stress, build problem solving skills and strengthen community.
