Revisions to Mandated Health Exams and Screenings for the 2018-2019 School Year

- Health examinations will be required for new entrants and in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.
- Vision screening for color perception, distance and near vision acuity will be required for new entrants within 6 months of admission to school. Distance and near vision acuity will be required in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Hearing screening utilizing pure tone testing will be required for new entrants within 6 months of admission to school and in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Scoliosis screening will be required in grades 5 and 7 for girls and grade 9 for boys.
- Changes for screening grades are effective starting 7/1/18 and will be **implemented starting with the 2018-2019 school year.**
