Librarians Jessica Regitano and Penny Feeney were delighted to host a special three-part book club centered around Angie Thomas's powerful and award-winning debut novel, The Hate U Give.

This unique initiative brought together enthusiastic 8th graders and high school students, all eager to delve into the important themes and compelling characters of The Hate U Give. Each participating student received their very own copy of the book, fostering a shared reading experience and insightful discussions.

The book club experience reached an extraordinary peak with the opportunity to see the author, Angie Thomas, in person! AP Environmental Science Field trip to Reworld and Onondaga Lake

The AP Environmental Science students went on a field trip to Reworld and Onondaga Lake. During the experience, students gained eye-opening insights into environmental issues and the importance of sustainability. They discovered that waste management practices vary significantly around the world. For example, in Europe, about 95% of trash is incinerated, leaving only 5% to end up in landfills. In contrast, the United States burns just 10% of its trash, with the remaining 90% going into landfills. We were struck by the amount of trash we encountered. It was concerning and motivated many of us to think about how we can reduce waste and better care for our environment.

We also learned that macroinvertebrates—small aquatic organisms—are more commonly found in cleaner water. Their presence is often an indicator of good water quality, which emphasizes the importance of maintaining healthy ecosystems. Lastly, we learned how deeply our actions impact the environment. We were impressed by the ongoing efforts to restore Onondaga Lake and make it a safer, cleaner place. It's exciting to think about the improvements still to come and how the lake's popularity and public use might evolve in the future.
