Poetry Making History

Fifth graders were inspired by the recent words of Amanda Gorman. She is the youngest inaugural poet in US history. Students watched her performance of “The Hill We Climb” from President Biden’s inauguration in January. Then students analyzed her powerful poem to understand its meaning and figurative language. They also watched an interview to learn more about Ms. Gorman’s background. Lastly, they created slides explaining their favorite quotes to be put on display. Some student excerpts; “Where can we find light in this never-ending shade?” It’s true because it’s hard to be positive in these tough times. “We’ve learned that quiet isn’t always peace.” I like this one because it is basically saying that you have to speak for yourself to get justice and not just stay quiet. In the poem “The Hill We Climb” by Amanda Gorman, one part of a sentence really stood out to me. She says, “a country committed to all cultures, colors, characters and conditions of man.” I think this quote is very special because it shows diversity in this country. She points out that black or white, Christian or Jewish, man or woman, old or young, are accepted in this country. 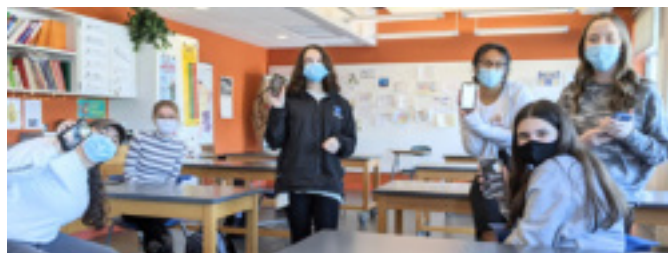
