- May 9, 2023 .....Deadline to request an Absentee Ballot Application be sent by mail
- May 16, 2023 .....Deadline to return completed **Absentee Ballot Application** by 5:00 pm
- May 16, 2023 .....Budget Vote/Board of Education Election in WHS Auditorium Foyer from 7:00 am – 9:00 pm

### As stipulated by NYS Law, the following qualifications MUST be met, without exception, in order to cast a vote:

- 1. You MUST be a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You MUST be at least 18 years of age.
- 3. You MUST be a resident of the district for at least 30 days prior to May 16, 2023.
