However, Mr. McLane is a very special representative due to his tremendous strength by not allowing his cerebral palsy to keep him from continuing his education and making a difference.

After graduating from Westhill, Mr. McLane attended Syracuse University and created a safe environment for handicapped students at the university. McLane worked tirelessly to provide students at Syracuse with the ability to get around the university easily. His efforts helped disabled students move past their impairments to be able to attend college. Upon graduation, McLane worked as an Assistant Commissioner of the New York Department of Education Office of Vocational and Educational Services for Individuals with Disabilities, as well as a delegate to the White House Conference on the Handicapped. Currently, he works as a Strategic Advisor to the Syracuse University's Inclusive Campus Initiative that encompasses all of the university's campuses. Also, Mr. McLane is the founder and President of Paradigm Solutions, a company that advocates for the disabled.

The university has set up an Endowment Fund and Fellowship for Brian McLane at Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs to honor him and his career that has been dedicated to helping others.
